

# True Potential Schrodgers Cautious Income

## Fund objective

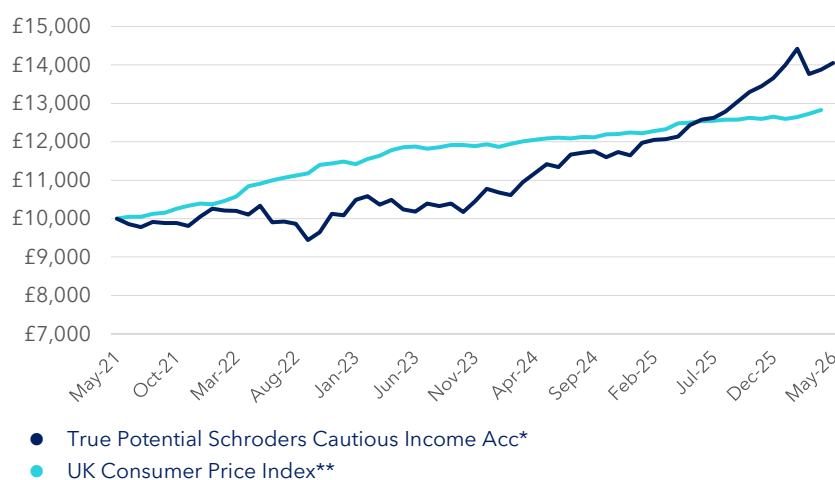
The investment objective of the Fund aims to deliver a total return in excess of inflation (UK Consumer Price Index) while aiming to provide an income of 3-5% per year on average, over rolling 5-year periods (net of fees).

## May Update

Global equities rose again in May amid hopes of a de-escalation in the Middle East and rally in artificial-intelligence (AI) names. Emerging Market (EM) equities led the gains and outpaced their developed market counterparts, driven by South Korea and Taiwan. In developed markets, US technology shares outperformed, while UK equities proved a laggard. In fixed income, UK Gilts did well, while US Treasuries underperformed.

The True Potential Schrodgers Cautious Income Fund returned 1.24% (net of fees), with the Fund's preference for UK equities proving a hindrance as the region underperformed the broader market. The exposure to energy and gold miners via the SISF Global Energy I Fund and the Schroder ISF Global Gold USD Fund detracted, with both posting negative returns. The alternatives segment also delivered marginally negative returns overall and underperformed sovereign bonds, dragged down by the Fund's exposure to the Montlake Invenomic US Equity Long/Short Fund. In contrast, the GLG UK Absolute Value Fund delivered the best gains within the segment. In fixed income, the allocation to UK Gilts was supportive over the period.

## What is the benchmark for this fund?

The benchmark for this fund is Consumer Price Index (UK CPI). The benchmark may be used as a guide to compare and assess the performance of the Fund. This fund uses the UK CPI which measures the rate of inflation in the UK, reflecting changes in the prices of a broad range of goods and services. By comparing the fund's performance against the UK CPI, the fund aims to ensure its returns outpace inflation, thereby maintaining the real value of investors' capital over time. Our aim is to help you monitor how your investment is performing. The Fund uses the benchmark as a target. The Fund is not constrained by it.

## Key fund information

**Accumulation shares:** this type of share reinvests the income generated by its underlying assets (such as dividends or interest) back into the fund, rather than paying it out to shareholders as income.

**Income shares:** this type of share pays out the income generated by the fund's underlying assets (such as dividends or interest) directly to investors, rather than reinvesting it back into the fund.

## Who is this fund suitable for?

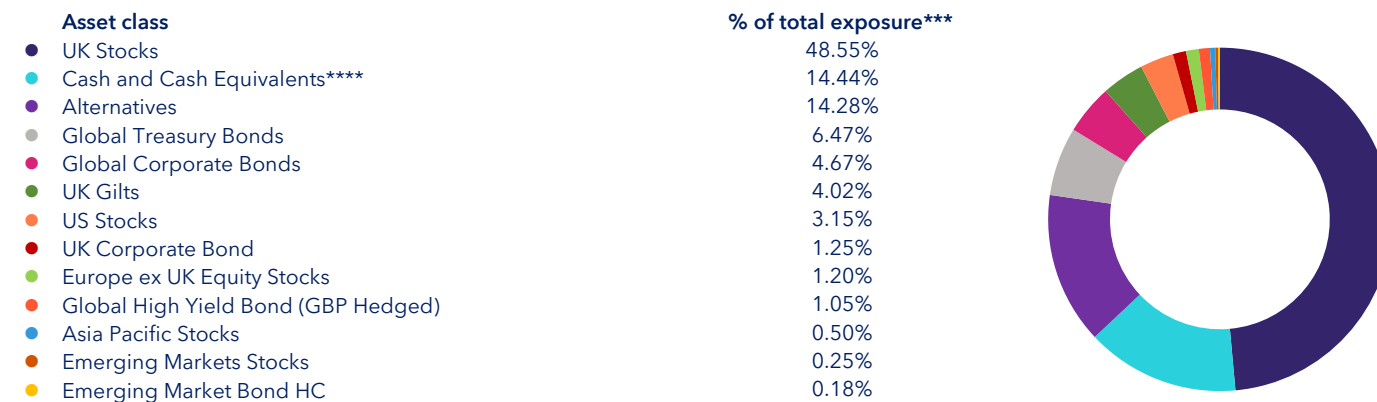

## What are the fees associated with investing in this fund?

The OCF of this fund is currently 1.01%. This means that if you invest £1000 in the fund, you can expect to pay £10.10 in fees over the course of a year. The fees you pay are pro-rata. If you hold the fund for less than a year you will only pay the proportional amount of fees applicable (based on the duration of your investment).

Risk type	Description
<b>Investment Fund Risk</b>	This Fund invests into other investment funds, they may invest in different assets, countries or economic sectors and therefore have different risk profiles not in line with those of this Fund.
