

True Potential Cautious Income Portfolio

Portfolio Objective

The objective of the True Potential Cautious Income Portfolio is to provide investors with a way to achieve their investment goals. This may be total return or a regular income. The Portfolio offers exposure to a select group of investment partners and a range of risk profiles, whilst remaining within the Cautious risk profile. We review the Portfolio monthly and, if necessary, rebalance to the allocation of styles we believe offers the best potential for yield within the Cautious risk profile. The Portfolio aims to produce a higher yield compared to an equally-weighted model of True Potential Wealth Strategy income funds.

Risk and Reward Profile



The Cautious Investor may be sensitive to short-term losses. A Cautious Investor's potential aversion to losses could compel them to shift into a more stable investment if significant short-term losses occur. Analysing the risk-return choices available, a Cautious Investor is usually willing to accept somewhat lower returns in order to assure greater safety of his or her investment.

Investment Commentary

The True Potential Cautious Income Portfolio returned +1.36% in January 2026.

Global equities made a strong start to the year (MSCI ACWI +3.0%, local currency terms) with Emerging Markets (+8.9%) the standout region, led by Taiwan and South Korea. These regions benefitted from ongoing demand in AI-related technology and strong earnings growth. A snap election in Japan sparked volatility, particularly in bond markets, however Japanese equities (+4.6%) still delivered a strong return on hopes that the ruling coalition will gain control of the lower house. Despite reaching highs during the month, the US was the worst performing equity region (S&P500 +1.4%) as geopolitical risks and concerns around central-bank independence weighed on sentiment. Notable performance outside of equities was in precious metals, as geopolitical tensions sparked a need for diversification. Gold delivered exceptional returns (+13.3%) in January but price moves have since been volatile and negative as uncertainty has eased. In bond markets, both US and UK government bond yields rose over January, negative for price returns. US yields rose as an improving balance of risks pushed out expectations for interest rate cuts.

Portfolio returns were supported by Schrodgers, which benefitted from its commodity-related equity positions, such as Gold mining companies and energy companies. The funds value style bias also provided a tailwind to returns. UBS also provided strong returns over the month, with tactical overweights to Emerging Market and Japanese equities supporting performance. No manager allocation changes were made this month, as we believe current positioning remains optimal. Key changes from managers include Goldman Sachs reducing a tactical position in European Health Care equities and Schrodgers building a position in Global Energy sector equities. TrinityBridge also rotated proceeds from maturing corporate bonds into select equities and short-dated gilts.


Growth of hypothetical £10,000 invested since inception



What are the fees associated with investing in this Portfolio?

The OCF of this Portfolio is currently 0.81%. This means that if you invest £1000 in the Portfolio, you can expect to pay £8.09 in fees over the course of a year. The fees you pay are pro-rata. If you hold the Portfolio for less than a year you will only pay the proportional amount of fees applicable (based on the duration of your investment).

Risk Type	Description
